LEGISLATIVE PROCESS

- Fifty plus legislative issue recommendations: Members and Stakeholders
- Surveys used to prioritize: sent to 500 on list-server
- Three stakeholder meetings: additional prioritization and input
- Legislative issues by topic:
 - ➤ Water governance
 - > Water policy
 - > Other topics
 - ➤ safe drinking water
 - ➤ funding
 - ➤ education
 - ≻ taxes
 - ≻ wastewater
 - ➤ water quality

GOVERNANCE ISSUES- SURVEY PRIORITIES

G1: SWCD status and funding—finding a solution-- Hearing

G2: Reactivation of Water Supply and Wastewater Advisory Council G3: Reactivation of the Legislative Water Commission

P1: Update GW Act of 1989- Waiting on MGWA White PaperG4:Creating a Department of Water ResourcesG5: Streamlining water governance and management

WATER POLICY- SURVEY PRIORITIES

- Evaluate preservation status of streams and lakes of the Upper Miss.
 Address disconnect between land and water: A plan to move the needle
- Plan for changes to water resulting from climate change--including floods and drought
- Water-Use Policy: Inter-basin transport protection (Water Train controversy)
- >Water retention-keep water on the land and urban storm water retention
- >Environmental justice issues: Lead and other drinking water issues?
- Enhanced GW recharge policy– Why, where and when?

OTHER TOPICS: SURVEY PRIORITIES

- <u>Water sustainability</u>: Adequate/clean water for the future--enhanced regional/digital atlas products
- Safe drinking water:
 - > Voluntary well testing; water safety planning; increased citizen involvement/ education
 - Assessing emerging contaminants in drinking water: pesticides and nutrients; Chloride reduction policy and support for reduction initiatives
 - > Address forever chemicals in food waste compost- Policy and assessment
 - > Upgrading drinking water infrastructure-funding and periodization issue
- Funding
 - > Promote healthy soil and healthy water
 - **Research and outreach: Promoting precision agriculture**
- <u>Taxes--</u>credit for private riparian buffer set-asides

NEXT STEPS

- Final stakeholder meeting- August
- Incorporate stakeholder comments
- Prepare draft bills
- Obtain consensus approval from subcommittee
- Determine authors in the House and Senate
- Introduce the bills early
- Solicit additional bill ideas from Subcommittee members

2021 SESSION RECAP

- This session we introduced 8 bills:
- Based on revisions of previous bills and additional issues
- Grouped by themes--from the 33 bill ideas
- Focused on Water Quantity, Water Quality, Safe
 Drinking Water, Wastewater, Water Retention, Water
 Governance and a Buffer Tax Credit
- Some parts of these bills moved forward

2022 SESSION

- Re-evaluate/revise bills from 2021
- Considering 45 relevant water issues
- Reduce list to those with greatest support using a survey
- Hold 3 stakeholder meetings--feedback on issues with the greatest support
- Reach consensus on a subset of bills
- Draft bills early fall
