





This cost savings will vary but the house will be much less thanks to the frost depth task advisory group (TAG).

Suggestion

Don't let partnership and cost savings be anomalies.

Executive branch required a legislative nudge to address border cities issues.

"I applaud Rep. Keeler and Sen. Eken for their persistent advocacy on behalf of their constituents. Were it not for their efforts, we wouldn't have convened a Technical Advisory Group to study this issue and find a creative solution," said DLI Commissioner Roslyn Robertson.

Suggestion

Urge Department of Labor & Industry to continue recognizing private sector and border city resourcefulness.

"It is clear technical experts are in the best position to consider and evaluate proposed changes to the building code, and the Construction Codes Advisory Council is the exact venue to review legislation such as this. I <u>urge other legislators</u> to rely on the council for any legislation related to building construction," says DLI Commissioner Roslyn Robertson.

Suggestion

Rely on the Construction Code Advisory Council, but <u>remember</u> Minnesota's diversity and border cities.

Border cities are underrepresented.
