- Source: subcommittee Members, legislators, stakeholders
- Details are available of each
- Surveys used to prioritize--500+ on list-server
- Three stakeholder meetings--additional prioritization and input
- Legislative issues:
 - **≻**Water policy
 - **≻**Water governance
 - >Other topics

Legislative Process

- Working with survey results and meeting comments
- Early October: bill narratives (about 10) for your review
- October meeting: Subcommittee decisions about legislative agenda



- Protect Priority Lakes in the Upper Mississippi: A plan to move the needle
- Water retention-both urban and rural
- Environmental justice: Lead and other drinking water issues
- Enhanced GW recharge policy—Why, where and when?
